

GENERAL INFORMATION

YASHODHAM HIGH SCHOOL is sponsored by GOENKA & ASSOCIATES EDUCATIONAL TRUST

Day to day affairs of running the school are being managed by the Principals assisted by appropriate staff under overall supervision of the School Committee comprising of 3 or 4 representatives of the Trust, the Principals and a representative of the teaching and non-teaching staff. The School Building is spacious with all modern facilities and is designed to accommodate students from STD I upto STD. X with a seating capacity of 3,800 students; working in two shifts. The motto of the school reads '**ivaGaaivanayaonaSaoaBatao'** which means 'MODESTY ADORNS KNOWLEDGE.'

The school does not receive any Grant-in-Aid from the Government and the only source of income is the amount of fees collected from the students.

The Trust holds exemption u/s 80G of the Income Tax Act and is registered with the Charity Commissioner under RegistrationNo.E8297 (BOM) dated 17-8-1981 as a Public Charitable Trust with the object to establish and/or run educational institutions.

Any constructive suggestion from the parents whose children are being admitted to the school shall always be welcome. The Trust Office is housed in the Yashodham High School Building, Goregaon(E), Mumbai- 400063, where such constructive suggestions can be recorded with the Trustee-in-charge.

Parent-Teacher Association has been established on 16.12.1997 vide circular from School Education Department of Government of Maharashtra. Each parent shall be a member of the PTA.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

- 1. YASHODHAM HIGH SCHOOL was founded on15.06.1987. At present Yashodham English Medium has Primary classes (Std. I to Std. IV), Secondary classes (Std. V to Std. X) The School is permanently unaided.
- 2. The School prepares students for the Secondary School Certificate Examination (S.S.C.E.) conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Education.
- 3. The academic year of the School begins in June.
- 4. The School has a well-equipped Library, Science Laboratories, Computer Laboratories and Audio Visual Room with latest equipment and offers Computer Education for both Primary and Secondary Sections.
- 5. Languages offered will be in accordance with the recommendations of Maharashtra State Board. Learning Marathi language is compulsory.
- 6. Physical training and outdoor games are compulsory (unless a doctor's certificate is produced).
- 7. Admission of children to the School is open to all irrespective of caste, creed, religion and sex.
- 8. Should the Parent/Guardian feel that his/her child is not making the desired progress the Principal should be contacted for guidance. OUR TEACHERS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO OFFER PRIVATE TUITIONS. The Parents are advised to refrain from engaging teachers either from the school or from outside for coaching, as such tuitions normally do more harm than good.
- 9. The school premises are under CCTV surveillance.

ADMISSIONS / WITHDRAWALS

- 1. Parents seeking admission for their ward in Std. I will have to produce any one of the following documents to confirm the date of birth.
- a. Birth certificate given by hospital / municipality.
- b. School leaving certificate from the Pre-Primary school.
- c. Affidavit filed by the parent.
- 2. For seeking admission the parent/guardian will have to fill the admission form online and attach scanned copy of necessary documents not exceeding the size as per the format given in the admission notification published on the school website.
- 3. At the time of admission in Std I, the age limit prescribed by the management from time to time shall be rigidly adhered to. No relaxation in age will be given.
- 4. On being granted admission, the parent/guardian will have to produce the necessary documents in original for verification.
- 5. A child coming from a recognized school will be admitted only when a School Leaving Certificate from the school he/she has last attended is produced. The School Leaving Certificate or Transfer Certificate should bear the recognition Saral Id No. of the student and UDISE No. (Primary/Secondary, as may be applicable).
- 6. All withdrawals from the school can be made only on the written request for the same giving one calendar months' notice or paying fees equivalent to one month in lieu of the notice period by the parent/guardian of the child to the Principal. Application for a leaving certificate, should be made by the parent/guardian on the prescribed form provided in the school calendar. Signatures of both the parents, is mandatory on the application form.
- 7. In case of request for a duplicate of the school leaving certificate, the parent/ guardian, will have to produce an affidavit stating therein what has happened to the original certificate and why a duplicate School Leaving Certificate is needed.
- 8. In case of adopted children, a certified copy of adoption document is to be submitted at the time of admission.
- 9. In all matters regarding admission, Principal's decision shall be final and binding on parents.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Wearing of clean and well ironed uniform is compulsory for students. Any student who comes to school without proper uniform or whose Appearance is untidy, continuously, is liable to be sent home.

Uniform and shoes other than the pattern recommended by the school will not be permitted.

STUDENTS SHOULD NOT COME TO SCHOOL WEARING SLIPPERS ON REGULAR DAYS AND EVEN DURING MONSOONS.

IN CASE OF UNFORESEEN CIRCUMSTANCES, SCHOOL MAY FUNCTION IN HYBRID MODE.

RULES REGARDING LEAVE, ABSENCE ETC.

- 1. Regular Attendance is essential.
- 2. Students must be present in the school after holidays/vacations on the re-opening day of the school. They must also remain present in the school on the last working day of the school, preceding the holidays/vacation. Such absence will be viewed seriously.
- 3. A medical certificate will have to be produced immediately in case of absence due to sickness and while resuming school after sickness, a medical fitness certificate must be submitted by the student.
- 4. A student should not remain absent from the school except in case of emergency. On the day on which he/she returns to school, the student must produce a note from his/her parent/ guardian stating the reason for the absence. The School accepts no responsibility if he/she is sent home with parent/guardian during class hours due to failure in producing a note or a Written application.
- 5. If the child is ill, suffering from some contagious disease, the Principal should be informed of the same within two days by the parent/guardian supported by a medical certificate. The child should not be sent to school till he/she is free from any danger of carrying infection. At the time of resuming school, the child must produce a medical fitness certificate,
- 6. Any student who is late in attending school, should bring with him/her a written application from his/her parent/guardian for late attendance. The School accepts no responsibility if he/she is sent home with parent/guardian during class hours due to failure in producing such written application.
- 7. No student will be permitted to leave school early, **No half day leave** will be granted.
- 8. Attendance and wearing of P.E. Uniform at official school functions, like Sports day, Independence day, Republic day etc. is compulsory. Absentees will be penalized.

RULES FOR STUDENTS

- 1. This is an English medium school. All the students are expected to speak in English.
- 2. The school uniform and identity card must be worn every day. A student without proper uniform will be sent back.
- 3. Uniform worn should be neat and tidy, hair properly combed and shoes well-polished.
- 4. Students should not wear jewelry, costly wrist watches and should not bring valuable items to school.
- 5. Books not recommended, magazines, comics etc, should not be brought to the school. No article liable to be a source of disturbance should be brought to school. Use of Mobile Phones in the school premises is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Students are expected to arrive at school before the assembly bell. Habitual late comers will be sent home after three late marks.
- 7. Any student coming late will not enter the class unless he/she brings a note to the teacher from the Vice-Principal/Principal.
- 8. Students must maintain silence in the school. They must maintain discipline when moving from one class to another, they should move in a single file only.
- 9. No student will be excused from Physical Education without a Doctor's Certificate.
- 10. No collections will be made by the students unless permitted by the Principal in advance.
- 11. Students are not allowed to give presents to the teachers,
- 12. Students are not allowed to distribute sweets/presents/eatables of any kind on their birthday. Instead they can voluntarily donate a book to the school library, to inculcate the good habit of reading and sharing.
- 13. Students should look after their books, clothes, pens, wrist watch, money, etc. School does not accept any responsibility for loss of such things.
- 14. Students should be regular, courteous, well-behaved, disciplined and clean in their dress and habits,
- 15. A student who is persistently insubordinate, willfully mischievous, guilty of Misconduct and/or has unwholesome influence on fellow students is liable to be expelled from the school
- 16. A student is responsible to the school not only for his/her behaviour in the school but also for his/her general behaviour outside. Every effort should be made by the student to keep up the good name of the school by his /her manners and department Students should greet their teachers/visitors when they meet them.
- 17. Students will not take part in any political activities.
- 18. During the absence of the teacher, the Prefect or Monitor will be responsible for The order and discipline of the class.
- 19. It is forbidden to buy eatables from street vendors.
- 20. Students are expected to keep THE SCHOOL PREMISES CLEAN.
- 21. All students are expected to:
 - show respect to all the teachers.
 - avoid shouting, whistling or running in the school building,
 - avoid using indecent language
 - avoid throwing paper, stones etc, anywhere in and around the School premises, except in the bins provided for the purpose.
 - observe all the rules of good conduct on the buses and on the streets while coming to or returning from school.

SAFETY MEASURES

- 1. Students should compulsorily wear the identity-card issued to them by the school along with their uniform.
- 2. Parents should always possess the identity card issued by the school when they enter the school premises.
- 3. Parents should inform the school authority regarding the particulars of the person they delegate to collect their children from school, if they are not doing so themselves, An identity card will also be issued for the guardian/s which they have to carry when they enter the school premises.
- 4. Children should be given the following instructions periodically and children should be alert at all times:
 - Children should not talk to strangers, accept anything in cash or kind from strangers.
 - Children should never agree to go home with strangers.
 - Children should not agree to go home even with a relative without prior confirmation with their parents.
 - Children should not talk loudly on streets or in front of strangers about any situation of their home or about the time when their parents are not at home.
 - Children should always move around in groups, especially to and from school.
- 5. It is imperative for parents to collect their children from the point at which they are left by the school bus otherwise the children will be brought back to school.
- 6. Parents should explain the concept of good touch and bad touch to their children.
- 7. Parents can form car pool groups for safe transportation of children.
- 8. Parents should supervise/stay with the children when they go down to play.
- 9. Sending children to shops/shopping centre, alone should be avoided
- 10. Parents should ensure that the correct phone numbers of the residence and office are written in Form A.
- 11. Parents are advised not to send their children to school if they are unwell.
- 12. Along with the values learnt in school, it is of utmost importance to lay stress on cleanliness and hygiene and above all a sense of responsibility.

STRATEGIES AT STUDENT LEVEL

Students to be encouraged to:

- ✤ take responsibility for managing their digital reputation,
- trust each other respectfully online and offline.
- ✤ understand the importance of protecting their password.
- think about where they are travelling to and whether it is a safe place to spend their online time.
- be aware that people can pretend to be anybody they want online, so it is best to have only offline friends.
- share their experience of cyber bullying with adults.

STRATEGIES AT THE PARENT/FAMILY LEVEL

- ✤ Place computers in a central location at home.
- Be active in your child's life and know who their friends are both online and offline.
- Look out for signs of bullying such as:
- 1. Loss of interest in school.
- 2. Not wanting to spend time with friends.
- 3. Anxiety around technology uses.
- 4. Being depressed.
- 5. Difficulty in sleeping.
- 6. Lower school performance.
- ✤ Keep evidence of cyber bullying.
- Set up an alert on Google.
- Educate your child not to leave her / his mobile phone lying around where others can use it, without permission.

NETIQUETTES

Netiquette (net + etiquette) is the "code of conduct" applied to online spaces. Teaching students about netiquette is just as important (if not more so) as teaching them to use technology or master content. Much like traditional etiquette, which provides rules of conduct in social situations, the purpose of netiquette is to help construct and maintain a pleasant, comfortable, and efficient environment for online communication, as well as to avoid placing strain on the system and generating conflict among users.

Parents and students are requested to follow the below mentioned netiquettes for joyful and holistic learning.

ONLINE NETIQUETTES FOR PARENTS

- Attendance during online class is mandatory.
- Motivate your child to attend the classes with the spirit as he/she attends school.
- Ensure that your child has breakfast and is ready for school-online classes in proper school uniform.
- Parents must send an official Email regarding the absentee of their child.
- Parents should ensure that the time table of the child should be put up for their reference somewhere in the room.
- Ensure that the students should sit in a well-lit room.
- Provide a dedicated place for the child to attend to his/her online classes without any disturbance. Kindly ensure that the room is clear of any distractions.
- Provide your child with a laptop/PC preferable/ notebook/tablet/smart phone with a high speed internet connection and earphone.
- Parents should ensure that there is no disturbance when the child is attending online classes.
- Parents should also emphasize on maintaining correct posture during the teachinglearning session and train the students accordingly on the same.
- The timetable shared by the school should be followed diligently.
- Parents need to monitor their ward frequently during the online classes to ensure the child is using the device for classes only and remains focused on the online learning session.

ONLINE NETIQUETTES FOR STUDENTS

- Wear school uniform/PE uniform/decent attire to attend your classes.
- The students should sit in a well-lit room & report 10 minutes prior to the scheduled commencement of the class with electronic devices fully charged.
- Be fully equipped for the class with paper pen, textbooks and water bottle by your side before starting the online session.
- The students should not annotate on screen until and unless instructed by the class teacher/ subject teacher.
- The student needs to have more than 75% of attendance in each subject.
- If the student is unable to attend the class, then prior information should be given to the class teacher/ subject teacher.(Leave Application) on official Email ID.
- Please login with your official email account for Google Classroom.
- The students are supposed to switch on their cameras and switch off their microphone (unless required to speak).
- Engage fully in online work without any background distractions. Log Out from all social media, so that you are not distracted during the lesson.
- Avoid conversation with family members during online class.
- The students should raise hands or use the chat box to pose their questions and queries. Before posing your questions just check if anyone has already asked it and received a reply.
- Don't post irrelevant links, comments, thoughts or pictures.
- Always remember to say 'PLEASE' and 'THANK YOU' while soliciting help from your teachers or classmates.
- Respect the opinion of your classmates. Acknowledge that others are entitled to have their own perspective on the issue discussed in the class.
- Stay focused on the teaching and take down appropriate notes while the teacher is teaching.
- Complete and submit all learning tasks, assignments & homework assigned by your teachers on a scheduled date.
- Refrain from taking screenshots or recording the lesson during the online class.
- No eating/ munching is allowed during the session. However, you are allowed to drink water if needed.
- Students would be given 5 minutes at the end of every class to interact with the teacher.

RULES FOR THE SCHOOL LIBRARY

1. The Library is open fromMonday to Friday: 8.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.Saturday: 9.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m.

- 2. Pupils will be given library cards for borrowing books and each pupil is responsible for the books taken on his/her card. The librarian shall confiscate the cards of the students who contravene the library rules.
- 3. Books will be issued for the use of the BORROWER only.
- 4. A pupil can borrow or return books once a week only.
- 5. Books should not be kept for more than a week. At the end of each period the books may, if desired, be renewed at the discretion of the Librarian. However, for such a renewal, the book must be produced.
- 6. Failure to return a book on the expiry of the period of a week, the pupil will be penalized (`1/- per day).
- 7. Books must be kept clean and used carefully. No marking should be done in the Library book. Any imperfection found in them or any damage done to them must be reported to the School Librarian before taking the book home. The damage done to books or magazines and loss of books will have to be made good by the pupil concerned
- 8. Reference books and magazines cannot be borrowed or taken out of the Library.
- 9. Students must consult the Librarian/teacher for the books recommended for their specific age group and record should be maintained. (Library Record)
- 10. All books must be returned in good condition before the beginning of each Terminal Examination and before a Leaving Certificate is issued. The borrower who fails to return a book must pay a fine equal to the value of the book.
- 11. No personal books, bags, satchels, electronic gadgets and eatables are allowed in the library. Any personal books found will be confiscated. Only note-books, school calendar and a pencil may be taken in.
- 12. Every pupil should help to keep the Library clean and tidy and see that the books and magazines are kept in their proper places.
- 13. Strict silence must be observed in the Library and conversation should be kept to the minimum and sound should be low.
- 14. The Library should be used only for perusing reference books, parallel textbooks, periodicals and reviews.
- 15. Before taking the School Leaving Certificate/Hall Ticket every student is requested to return all Library books and get the Librarian's signature in the application for Clearance Certificate.

LABORATORIES

Facilities to use all the laboratories are available to students from Std. III upwards. All experiments will be undertaken in the presence of and with the knowledge of the teacher and the Laboratory Assistant.

Pupils are requested to take special care of the Laboratory materials and apparatus. The cost of repairs and replacements if any will be borne by the pupils concerned. No pupil is allowed in the Laboratory except during Practical Periods.

IN-HOUSE SPORTS COACHING

At GAET, Sports are given a place of prominence in conjunction with cocurricular activities. We firmly believe that a 'healthy mind resides in a healthy body and hence encourage each and every child to participate in sports. Coaching facilities for Handball, Throwball, Basketball and Football are extended to all the students during school hours. Students learn different skills required to play these games and it also helps them to increase their strength and stamina.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS

- 1. - 2. Parents and Guardians are reminded that without their help and co-operation not much can be achieved by the efforts made by the school to mould and improve the character of the child. They are earnestly requested to instill discipline.
- 3. Parents are also earnestly requested to peruse and sign the reports of the child, or any other remarks made by the School Authorities.
- 4. Parents should not engage school teachers as private tutors, vide item 8 under School Information. We strongly discourage private tuitions. Instead, we would suggest that you inculcate in your ward the habits of self-study and regularity in study. And also create at home a conducive atmosphere to study. Avoid all kinds of disturbances like T.V. radio, video, internet etc. Let your child surf the net only for essential information under your supervision.

5 No parent will be allowed to handover any stationery/educational material/tiffin boxes/water bottle etc to their ward during school hours.

- 6 Parents are requested to refrain from giving any gifts to the members of the staff.
- 7. Parents are requested to refrain from celebrating their child's birthday in school in any way.
- 8. If any student is found to have done damage of any kind in class or in and about the school premises the parents/guardian will have to make good the loss. Decision of the Principal regarding the amount to be paid will be final.
- 9. Criticism of your child's teachers in the presence of children should be avoided as it encourages them to lose respect for their teachers. In case of any grievance kindly meet the Principal.
- 10. **IDENTITY CARD FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS/SERVANTS IS A MUST FOR ENTERING THE SCHOOL PREMISES.** Parents are requested to refrain from entering the school premises except for meeting the Principal or Teachers by appointment. Parents are requested to advise servants/guardians who come to collect your wards from school, not to remain in the school premises any longer than is necessary.

- 11. Parents are advised to make it a point to attend the Open House as indicated in the calendar. They will not be allowed to meet the teachers without prior permission from the Principal on other working days.
- 12. If your child is suffering from infectious conditions like viral fever, conjunctivitis, acute cough and cold, Chicken Pox etc, kindly refrain from sending him/her to school as it leads to spread of infection. All parents are advised to take this as a moral responsibility in preventing the spread of infection among students as well as staff and care givers in school. Children suffering from any such infectious condition will not be allowed to attend school without producing a Fitness Certificate.
- 13. In case your child is suffering from any acute medical conditions such as
 Asthma Febrile Convulsions (Fits) Juvenile diabetes Migraine Depression / Psychological problems or any other, kindly keep the school authorities informed
 - in writing about the following. 1. Telephone Number of Parents
 - 2. Person to be contacted immediately in case of emergency.
 - 3. Medication / First Aid to be given.
 - 4. Telephone number of the Doctor.
 - 5. Brief medical history of the child.
- 14. Parents and guardians are requested to notify the school of any change in their address, telephone number and Email ID
- 15. Parents and guardians are requested to check the mails sent by the school regularly.
- 16. There will be a penance study class for an hour for those who fail to do homework, or for any other reason that the teacher or the Principal will state. Please Note:

If the child is detained or sent back during school hours due to said reason, in that case the responsibility towards security of the child will not be that of the school.

17. Parents are advised not to request for half days or leave, as project assignments and assessments will be conducted regularly. Absence will lead to irregularity in testing procedures and incompletion of day to day work.

Bullying and teasing amongst students (A concern)

IMPORTANT NOTE

- 1. Display of any disorderly conduct, doing of any act which causes or likely to cause physical/or psychological harm, raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in or outside the school, which includes abusing, threatening or playing practical jokes or leaving and causing hurt to any student is strictly prohibited.
- 2. Asking any student to do or forcing him to do something which a student will not in the ordinary course willingly do, is also a punishable offence.
- 3. Any such disorderly act found by the institution, will be subject to an enquiry by a Committee constituted by the school.
- 4. If students involved are found to be at fault, the same will be reported to the competent authorities for necessary action.
- 5. In addition such students are liable to be dismissed from the school. They may not be able to get admitted in any Educational Institution for a period of five years.

RULES REGARDING FEES

- 1. Term fees must be paid in June along with I-Quarter Tuition Fee and in December along with III-Quarter Tuition Fee. Fees can be paid Quarterly, half-yearly or yearly.
- 2. Fees for the months of April and May must be paid along with March fees and this holds good even for those who wish to leave the school in March / April / May.
- 3. The delay of payment beyond 3 months renders a pupil liable to be struck off the roll. If the pupil is re-admitted the Admission fee must be paid again.
- 4. If a student is to be withdrawn, one calendar month's notice should be given in writing by the Parent/Guardian to the Principal of the School to arrange for the refund of the balance of tuition fees. In exceptional circumstances of withdrawal, one month's tuition fee in lieu of one calendar month's notice will have to be paid. Amount collected as Term Fee or Tuition Fee will not be refunded.
- 5. Students whose fees are not paid will not be allowed to sit in the class. They also may not be allowed to appear for Test / Examinations.
- 6. Unless all dues are paid by the student, the results of the examinations/tests conducted by the School will not be communicated to the student. School Leaving Certificate will not be issued till all the outstanding dues from the student at the time of leaving the School are paid and clearance certificate from the concerned authority is obtained.
- 7. Students who leave the School in the month previous to any vacation must pay the fees for the vacation.
- 8. No deduction in fees will be allowed for vacations or for broken period of the month. Full month's fee will be payable if the student's name appears on the roll on the 1st day of the month. Admission fee will not be refunded even if the student, for any reason, leaves the School immediately after securing admission.
- 9. Std. X students will have to pay fees till May, in the month of December. (on or before 11th December)

FEES

School fees will be accepted only **quarterly**, **half yearly** Or **annually**. > <u>Procedure for payment through Demand Draft</u>:

- Fee Payment made from 1st of the due month till working day prior 11th of the due month will be accepted through Demand Draft only.
- Demand Draft should be in favour of 'Yashodham High School and Junior College'
- Write the child's name, Std./Div, UID No., months for which fees is paid, contact number on the reverse of Demand Draft.
- Demand Draft should be paid only at the School fee counter.

General Instructions:

- 1) A charge of `100/- for a bounced cheque will be levied. Thereafter, fees, along with fine, must be paid by My CAMU app, DD or Pay Order.
- Payment made from the 12th of the due month shall be received by Demand Draft in the school office with a surcharge of `200/- per month or part thereof additionally.

BUS FACILITY

The school provides bus service to the students of the Primary Section and Secondary Section of YHS under the aegis of G.A.E.T.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- The bus facility is extended to students only when there is an availability of seat and is offered at the Principal's discretion. This offer can be withdrawn any time
- Students will board and alight only at fixed bus stops. Parents and children are requested not to ask the driver or attendant to stop the buses at unauthorized bus stops.
- Parents are not permitted to change the bus stops, without prior permission. In case there is a change in the bus stop, the parents must inform the school in writing.
- In the event of the child not being at the stop at the scheduled time the bus will proceed without the child. It will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian to drop the child to School.

In the event of there being no one to receive the child at the stop of the return journey the child will be brought to the school and the parents will have to collect their child from the school authorities on presentation of their Identity Card.

- If the parent doesn't want their ward to avail the bus facility for some reason on a particular day, the school must be informed about it in writing.
- If in case for any reason, the parent drops the child to the school, Parent must inform the Bus Department Supervisor & the Principal, so that the child can avail of drop facility if required.
- In case of any grievance, parents must inform the school authorities in writing for appropriate action. Parents must not enter or board the school bus for any reason.
- A bus tracking facility shortly called **TRACKIFY** has been introduced. It is end-to end system that uses GPS and cell tower data in conjunction to give a precise location of the bus your child is travelling in. Using the "Trackify parent" app one can view the real time location of the bus along with other relevant information like Estimated Time of Arrival(ETA) so that the parent can know when precisely the school bus will be arriving and therefore avoiding any inconveniences.

BUS FACILITY

IDENTITY CARD :

• Children using the bus facility need to wear a Bus ID Card issued by the School which must have the bus number on it.

- In case there is a change in the residential address the school office must be notified immediately and a fresh ID Card must be obtained.
- If the Bus ID Card is lost a written application requesting a duplicate ID Card must be submitted in the school office immediately. Collect the duplicate ID Card from the School Office.

WITHDRAWAL

- Parents must note that no refund will be made against bus fees Paid.
- One month advance notice in writing must be given by the parents to the school office, in case they wish to discontinue the bus facility. (Applicable only if student is leaving school or changing residence.) Viz
- For withdrawal after I term the duly filled in withdrawal form must be submitted by the 10th of October to the school office.
- For withdrawal after II term the duly filled in withdrawal form must be submitted by the 10th of April to the school office.

Note:

- Rs.2500/- fee is payable as Admission Fee (Non-refundable) at the time of admission.
- Bus enrollment form should be filled and submitted along with each installment of the Bus fees.
- No bus child will be permitted to go home without submitting the permission letter.

BUS FEES

Bus fees will be accepted by My CAMU app only.

• General Instructions :

1) The bank will levy a charge of 100/- for a bounced cheque.

Thereafter, fees, along with fine, must be paid by My CAMU app.

2) Students will not be allowed to avail the bus facility if the fee is not received as and when informed by the school.

CONDUCT OF CHILDREN IN THE SCHOOL BUS

(Rules to be followed for a safe ride)

- 1. Children should not carry any electronic communication device/gadget in the school bus.
- 2. Students should be seated before the bus can move and fasten the seat belt. They should not stand until the bus comes to a complete halt.
- 3. It is mandatory for the children to wear the I-Card issued by the school.
- 4. They should be able to carry their belongings on and off the bus by themselves.
- 5. Reasonable silence must be maintained on the bus journey to ensure that the driver is not disturbed.
- 6. No bullying or dangerous behaviour will be tolerated. The offender will not be allowed to use the bus after one warning.
- 7. No part of the student's body or any object belonging to students should protrude from the bus window or door.
- 8. Children should not litter the bus. Cleanliness has to be maintained.
- 9. Any willful damage to the bus or equipment in the bus like fire extinguisher, CCTV Camera, etc. should be reported to the headmistress and the offender will be dealt with severely.
- 10. Children must obey and must be courteous to the bus-in-charge. Children found misbehaving in the bus will not be allowed to continue availing the bus facility.

EVALUATION

As per the Maharashtra Education department's directive, the school has adopted the Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) pattern from the academic year 2010 - 2011 for the classes I to VIII.

CCE involves Formative and Summative Evaluation throughout the year. The various techniques used in Formative Evaluation help in shaping the personality of the student. (physical, intellectual, emotional and overall development)

Summative Evaluation is done at the end of each term, which consists of written, oral / practical formats.

Parents should ensure that the children strictly adhere to the Formative Evaluation technique schedule (which will be given by the respective subject teachers) on calendar page nos.58-59.

A student must have a minimum of 75% of attendance of the total working days.

For Std. IX Annual promotion is done on the basis of aggregate performance of students throughout the year. Evaluation includes project work in Physical Education, assignments in Social Science, Mathematics and languages.

There will be two unit tests and two terminal examinations in the year. Promotion to the next class will be decided on the basis of relevant rules in force from time to time.

All submissions of assignments should be on time. In case of delay, the child is liable to be detained after school (Secondary) / called before school hours (Primary) for completion.

Students will be allowed to carry only transparent writing pads and a transparent pencil pouch during examination. Text books /note books / reference books or any other paper related to the examination should be strictly avoided during examination.

A student found resorting to unfair means in an examination/assessment/test will be disallowed to appear in that subject and will be assigned zero in that subject. Infringement of the rules of examination by any student will make the student liable to severe punishment.

REPETITION OF UNFAIR MEANS MAKES THE STUDENTLIABLE FOR DISMISSAL

However, he/she may be allowed to appear for all the other subjects of the examination/assessment/test at the discretion of the Principal.

Students not following examination rules will be detained.

Result once declared will be final.
